### By car

**Coming from the North or Northeast:** BR-010, BR-020 or BR-030 highways  
**Coming from the Southwest:** BR-040 highway until Cristalina/GO and then BR-050 highway  
**Coming from the Southeast:** BR-050 highway  
**Coming from the Middle West:** BR-060, BR-070 and BR-080 highways or BR-384 highway until Jataí/GO and then BR-060 highway  
**Coming from the South:** BR-153 highway and then BR-060 highway

## Transportation services to and from the Airport

### Bus

To provide more comfort to those going to the central region of Brasilia the BUS LINES 113, 113.1 and 113.2 executive buses travel between the airport and the North and South hotel sectors, passing by the Brasilia Convention Center. Daily service with buses departing every 30 minutes.

**Working hours: Monday to Friday, from 6:30am to 12am and Saturday, Sunday and holidays from 6:30am to 11pm.**

### Taxi

Passengers arriving in Brasilia may choose the regular taxis that serve the airport. On Terminal 1 the taxi stand is located on the Arrival floor in front of the Domestic Arrival. For dial-a-taxi services, the boarding point is on the same floor, near the parking payment window.

There is also the pre-paid executive taxi service. In this modality, passengers can pay the ride with credit or debit card, at a fixed value defined depending on the region of destination. The service can be acquired at the Domestic Arrival area and at the public area on the ground floor.



## Addresses in Brasilia

Walking around Brasilia is very easy. It follows an almost mathematical logic, as shown in the chart below. The Eixo Monumental divides the city into Asa Sul on one side, and Asa Norte on the other. The Eixo Rodoviário, also known as Eixão, goes from one Asa to the other. Each Asa has 16 blocks that start being counted from the meeting point of the Eixos. The blocks starting with the odd hundreds (100, 300, 500, 700 and 900) are above the Eixo Rodoviário, while the even hundreds (200, 400, 600 and 800) are below it.



## Transportation in Brasilia

### Car

Car is a great option to move across Brasilia. The traffic logic is very easy. When you understand it, you can't get wrong. Pedestrians are much respected in Brasilia. Therefore, stopping for pedestrians to cross the zebra crossing is not only a law, but a use. If someone makes the "sign of life" (as is known the gesture pedestrians make for the cars to stop) do not hesitate to stop. **In Brasilia we avoid honking.**

### Bus

The Plano Piloto Bus Terminal is the main central point of the bus routes. From there you can take a bus to virtually all the Federal District and the entorno (vicinities) that is how the region of Goiás surrounding the Federal District is known. The bus peak time is between 7am and 8:30am and from 5pm to 7pm. The fleet is reduced during dawn. **One of the most common bus lines is the so-called Grande Circular which runs the whole Asa Sul and Asa Norte.**

### Subway

You can also take the subway to some regions of Brasilia. The Plano Piloto Bus Terminal is the starting point, following to Asa Sul, Park Shopping and the Inter-state Bus Terminal, Guará Open Air Market and the cities of Águas Claras, Taguatinga, Ceilândia and Samambaia.

**Open hours: Monday to Saturday from 6am to 11:30pm, and Sundays and holidays from 7am to 7pm.**

### Taxi

In Brasilia you hardly stop a taxi on the street. The main buildings of Plano Piloto have taxi stands. All you have to do is go there and take the first car in the line. **Dial-a-taxi services are the most usual in Brasilia.** Many companies offer this service. If you are in a restaurant or hotel, just ask an employee to call a taxi. If you are on the street and without a mobile phone, the companies accept collect calls.

### App-based private urban transportation

The private urban transportation is legalized in Brasilia. Download the app of the company of your choice and run the city will all comfort, safety and convenience.

### Bicycles

Shared bikes are a sustainable and healthier transportation option, and also improve quality of life. On the stations spread over strategic sites of the city, you can take a bike using the +BIKE app that can be downloaded on your smartphone. After use, you can return the bike to any station.

You can monitor in real time the bikes and stations, and know exactly where are the stations/bikes and/or parking spaces available using the website, the project app or the QR Code beside.



## Where to stay?

Most hotels in Brasilia are downtown, on South and North hotel sectors, about 15 minutes far from the President Juscelino Kubitschek International Airport and near the main attractions and tourism sites.

Hotels meet a huge demand from Brazil and many other countries, since Brasilia is the political center of the country, and hosts several events and businesses, as well as diplomatic representations. Occupancy is higher during week, from Tuesday to Thursday. On weekends, there are more free rooms at special rates. This is a great time to get to know Brasilia and its beauties.
